• South Hill

Neighborhood board has approved giving a donation to the 11 homeless students that attend Lowell Elementary. Next neighborhood meeting is in one week at the Cruise Terminal with the Port of Bellingham director.

• King Mountain

Nothing to report – a thank you to Janice and Mayor Fleetwood for attending a trail walk with the neighborhood.

• Happy Valley

Busy with the Larrabee 21<sup>st</sup> street right-of-way. Pollinator garden has gone in, the small and simple grant will add a couple of benches to this. Property across from Joe's Gardens has gone up for sale, and they're hoping the City will purchase it for Greenways.

• Mayor Fleetwood commented to say that the city is looking into this and that he will keep everyone updated.

#### • Fairhaven

Lots of concern about a new development at 915 and 917 8<sup>th</sup> street because it is next to Padden Creek. Another development at 801 Donovan has caused a lot of concern as well.

#### • Cordata

Kathy Bell from Planning visited at the last neighborhood meeting to talk about a new development in the neighborhood. The neighborhood hopes to get restaurants or coffee shops built. Funding for the amphitheater in Cordata Park was not met, so they are looking into doing a pavilion instead.

#### • Cornwall

Neighbors are excited about the small and simple grant. Had a meeting with the planning department to learn more about how development in the neighborhood works.

#### • Sunnyland

Picnic will be held in August, elections in November.

• WWU

Will be returning 2/3 in person in the Fall. Hope to be completely back in person in Winter. Successful move-out weekend last weekend. New residence hall will be open in the Fall.

• Samish

There will be a meeting about the Mill Avenue overlay project. First picnic in 2 years will be held at Lake Padden. Lots of discussion about the City View project.

• Columbia

Chalk festival scheduled for the 4<sup>th</sup> of July. Elizabeth Park Concert Series is planned for this summer again.

#### • City Center

Starting to get a little bit back to normal downtown. New market on Wednesday down at Waypoint Park. Saturday Farmer's Market has been growing. First Friday art walk has buskers now. Lots of crime persists in the north side of downtown. Concern about a possible new tiny home development on Cornwall. Concerns about what the police can actually do about crime downtown.

• South

Next meeting is at the end of July.

• Lettered Streets

Concerns regarding a remodel of the Haggen on Meridian and the possibility of adding housing.

• York
