MAYORAL PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, the contributions and sacrifices of the men and women who serve in the Armed Forces have been vital in maintaining our freedoms and way of life; and

WHEREAS, tens of millions of Americans have served in the Armed Forces of the United States during the past century and hundreds of thousands of Americans have given their lives; and

WHEREAS, our state is home to more than 544,000 veterans, 60,000 Active Duty military, 18,000 National Guard and Reserves and their families; and

WHEREAS, the Bellingham area is home to more than 13,000 veterans; and

WHEREAS, our veterans understand the important task before the American service men and women now keeping watch; and

WHEREAS, over 1.1 million veterans live below the poverty level and there are tens of thousands of homeless veterans; and

WHEREAS, it is estimated that up to 30% of post-Vietnam veterans have had Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) in their lifetime; and

WHEREAS, veteran suicide rates are twice that of the civilian population.

WHEREAS, our veterans are brave and selfless individuals who, when duty called, willingly put themselves in harm's way to defend the lives and liberty of others; and

WHEREAS, their abiding patriotism and enduring devotion to the ideals on which the United States is founded can never fail to inspire us; and

NOW, THEREFORE, DO I, Seth Fleetwood, Mayor of the City of Bellingham, proclaim November 11, 2020 as

VETERAN'S DAY

in the City of Bellingham, Washington and encourage all residents in our City to reach out to all veterans, ask them how they are doing and acknowledge and honor their contributions and sacrifices that they have made to the principles of democracy, individual freedom, and human rights and offer assistance to veterans in need.
