Why Squalicum Creek?

Squalicum Creek is the largest salmon-bearing stream in Bellingham, and home to four out of the five types of Pacific salmon, as well as endangered steelhead trout. It has immense potential to support fish recovery.

The [Squalicum Creek Re-route habitat restoration project](#) separated the creek from Sunset Pond to improve water quality and expand habitat for fish and wildlife.
