#### **Proposed Topics**

Reliable Facilities & Services

Plan for and deliver an equitable, safe, costeffective, and reliable network of public facilities and services in alignment with the City's growth strategy.

City Buildings & Equipment

Develop, maintain, and plan for the future needs of the City's buildings and equipment.

Sustainable Funding

Proactively plan and implement a sustainable funding strategy for the anticipated capital facilities and service network needs.

City Utilities & Infrastructure

Plan for and implement a network of reliable City utilities and other infrastructure to support the community's growing and shifting needs.

Equitable Siting & Maintenance

Foster equitable, efficient, sustainable, and considerate siting and maintenance of public and private facilities and infrastructure.

**Private Utilities** 

Other Public Facilities & Infrastructure

Support a planned network of private utilities, systems, and other infrastructure that provide for community needs.

Coordinate with and support the provision of other public facilities and infrastructure.




