Description

Big Rock Trail runs between the Silver Beach Elementary School Trail and the Springland Subdivision area. Project also includes elimination of some social trails to protect native plant life. Planned park improvements include clearing, grubbing, site grading, trail construction, drainage, and site restoration.

The trail will be 6' wide and surfaced with crushed limestone.

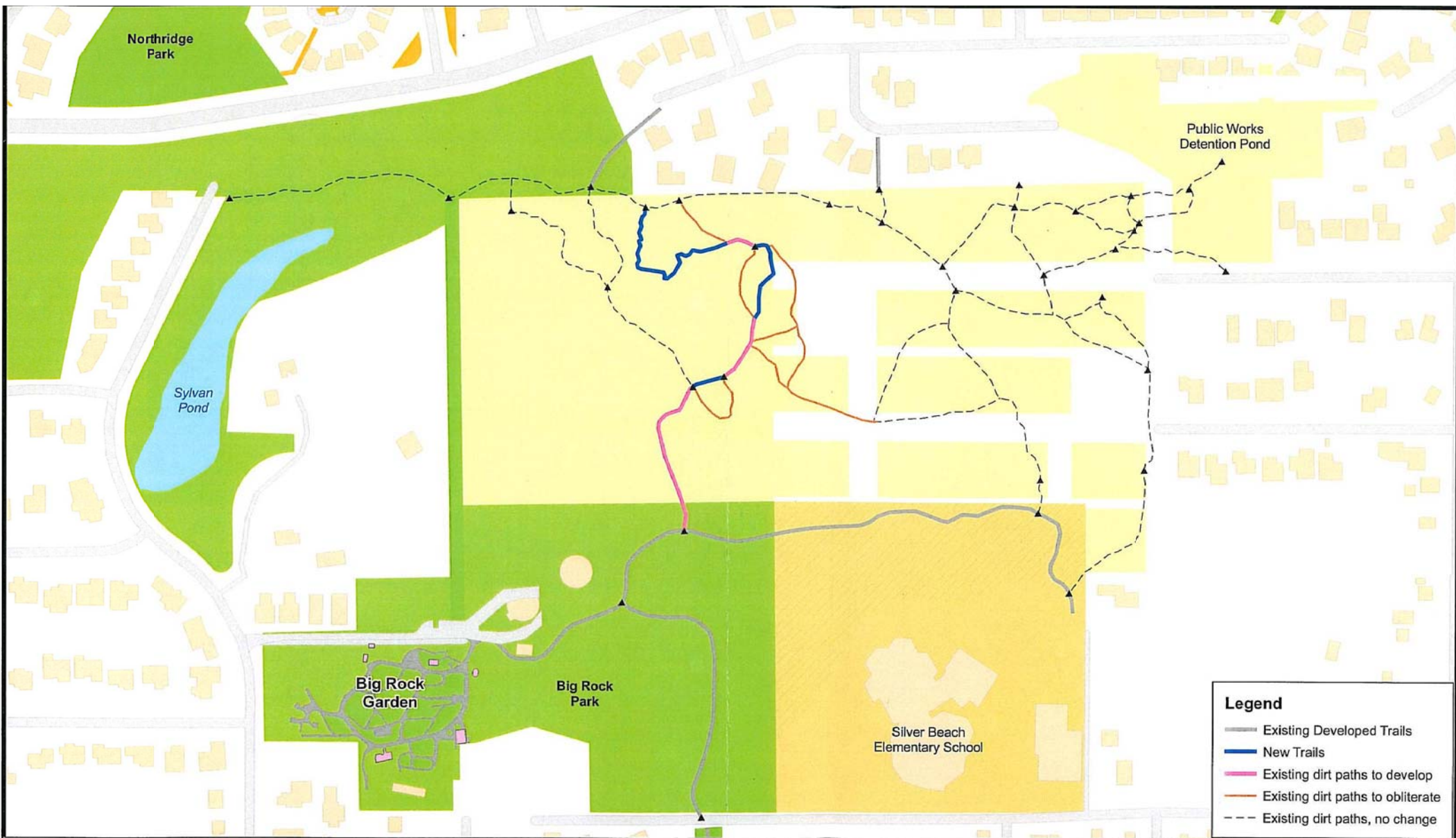

NOTICE TO NEIGHBORS

BIG ROCK TRAIL

Notice is hereby given to you that the construction of Big Rock Trail is tentatively scheduled to begin the morning of August 4, 2008, and be complete by the end of September.

This project involves the construction of a 6' wide crushed limestone trail from the Silver Beach Elementary School Trail to the Klipsun Trail (Springland Subdivision Area). Other aspects of the project are: obliteration of existing foot path, transplanting site ferns, relocation of forest duff, and planting of trees and shrubs.

The main construction access point is from the end of Balsam Lane and down the Silver Beach Trail to the starting point of the new trail shown on the attached sketch. Please note that although the Silver Beach Trail will remain open, trail users should be alert to the occasional passing of construction equipment using the same trail.
