WHEREAS, homelessness raises one's risk of illness, injury, victimization, and death and;

WHEREAS, service providers create relationships with people in the homeless community and they, along with friends and family members, need an opportunity to say goodbye and have closure in the grieving process and;

WHEREAS, people without homes have a lot to offer our community and this loss of life is a loss to us all and:

WHEREAS, uniting together as one community, we can end homelessness in Bellingham.

NOW THEREFORE, DO I, Kelli Linville, Mayor of the City of Bellingham, proclaim December 21, 2017,
