WHEREAS approximately one in every 700 babies are born with Down syndrome, representing about 6,000 births per year and there are about 250,000 people in the United States living with this condition found among all cultures and economic classes; and

WHEREAS people with Down syndrome possess a wide range of abilities, and are active participants in educational, occupational, social, and recreational circles of the community; and

WHEREAS the National Down Syndrome Society in 1995, developed the Buddy Walk of Whatcom County that is coordinated by Down syndrome Outreach, a program of The Arc of Whatcom County, and celebrates these achievements of children and adults with Down syndrome; and

WHEREAS the activities of the Buddy Walk will help promote programs and issues regarding education, advocacy, awareness and inclusion,

NOW, THEREFORE, DO WE, Kelli Linville, Mayor of the City of Bellingham, and Jack Louws, Whatcom County Executive, proclaim October 7, 2018, to be

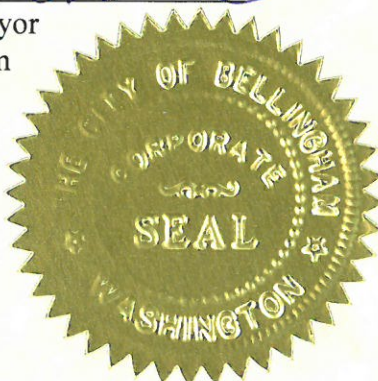
DOWN SYNDROME AWARENESS DAY
