Bellingham completed a [Pedestrian Master Plan](#) in 2012 and a [Bicycle Master Plan](#) in 2014. Each of these plans involved significant public input from each neighborhood throughout the City and each plan included recommendations to complete further studies on the Lakeway Drive corridor for pedestrian and bicycle safety improvements.

In 2016, Public Works has been engaged in a multi-agency effort with WTA, WSDOT, and transportation consultants to study pedestrian, bicycle, transit, automobile, and freight issues and needs on 1.36 miles of Lakeway Drive from Holly/Ellis, underneath Interstate 5, to Woburn/Yew as part of the [Lakeway Drive Bikeway Study](#) to examine existing conditions on the Lakeway Drive corridor and develop some possible alternatives for constructing sidewalk, crosswalk, and bicycle facility improvements, as recommended in Bellingham's Pedestrian and Bicycle Master Plans.

On **Tuesday September 13, 2016**, at **6:00pm**, Public Works will make a **15-minute presentation** providing background and then ask people to visit displays showing some alternative approaches to providing bicycle facilities on Lakeway Drive. The public is encouraged to interact with staff who can answer questions, listen to ideas, and address concerns about existing conditions or any of the alternatives. Public input from the Open House will result in further refinement of the alternatives and recommendations for improvements will be developed and presented in late 2016. 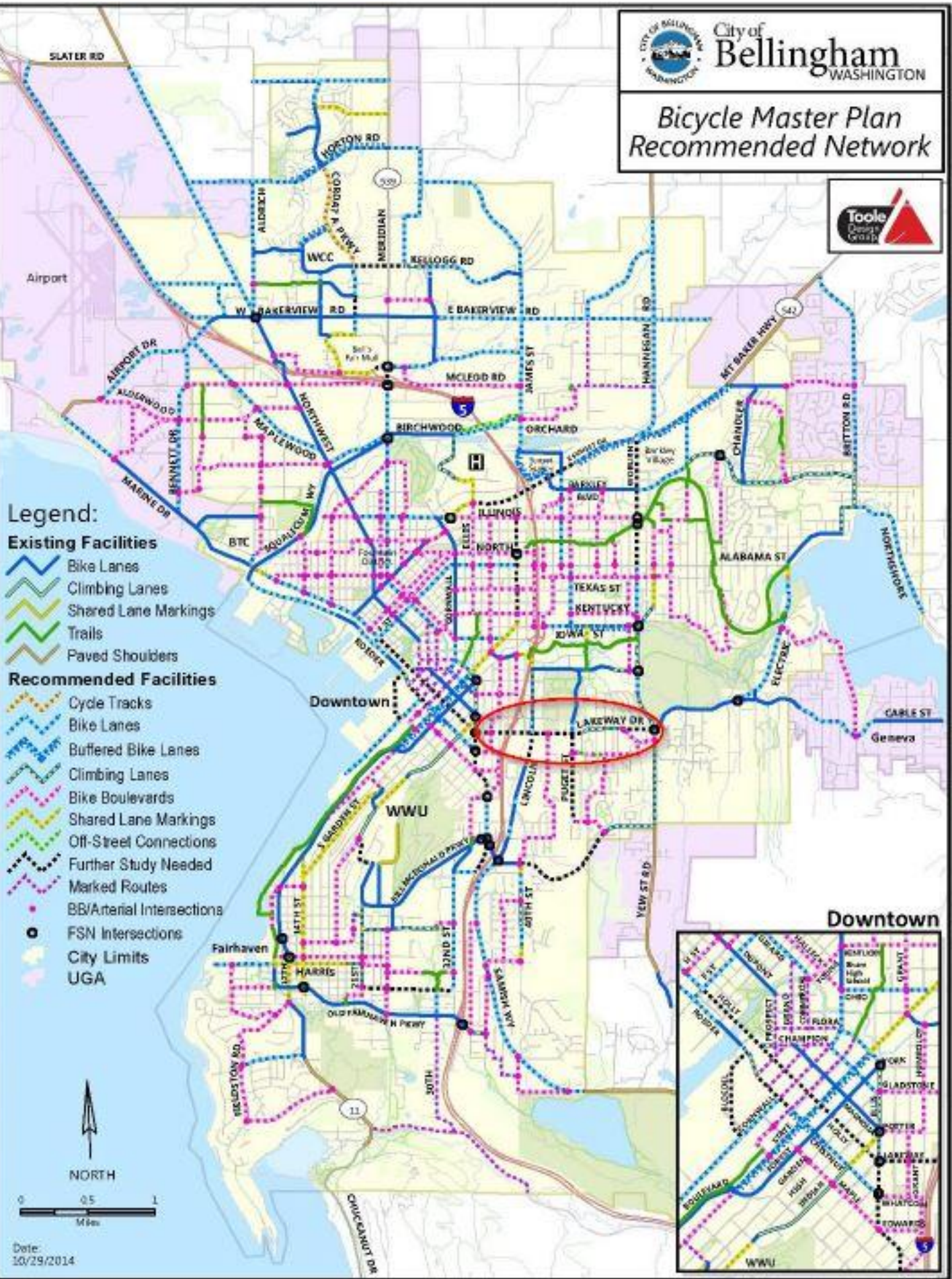

Bicycle Master Plan Recommended Network



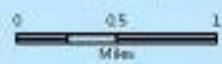
