
A Flealthier CREEK

The daylighted section of Padden Creek now contains habitat features such as native plants, rocks, and woody debris. These components of a healthy stream improve the physical, chemical, and biological integrity of Padden Creek.



WHAT CAN YOU DO?

- Remove invasive plants and cultivate native plants in your yard.
- On walks and at home, pick up dog poop and dispose of it in the trash.
- Fix car leaks and wash cars at a carwash so that oil, metals, and soaps do not run off into creeks.
- Stay on designated trails and keep pets on leash.
- Keep trash out of the creek and riparian area.
