 Wood is a favorite for smoking fish & carving dishes, spoons & masks; bark yields a red dye

Habitat Value

- Seeds & insects hiding in "cones" are eaten by small birds
- Leaves are eaten by some butterfly larvae

Characteristics

- Long male catkins appear before the leaves
- Clusters of small brown fruit "cones" stay on the tree over winter
