Ethnobotany

- Most valuable tree in the forest
- Wood was used for house construction, large carvings & canoes
- Bark, branches & roots used in making baskets, clothing & cordage

Habitat Value

- Grosbeaks, siskins & other birds eat seeds
- Squirrels & porcupines use bark for nesting
- Cavity-nesting birds roost & nest in mature trees

Characteristics

- Tiny scale-like leaves & small oval woody cones
- An evergreen tree with stringy bark that thrives in moist habitats
